

Paint Your Summer – Art Session #2: Cheat Sheet

Transform your inspiration study into a beautiful, finished painting

SUPPLIES NEEDED:

- Pencil or pen (some sort of drawing tool)
- A small canvas
- Some acrylic paints, with 3-4 colors you love
- Soft Gel or Modge Podge
- Some pretty collage papers
- Acrylic markers
- Old hotel key card or similar
- Scissors, palette, water cup, brushes

3 STEPS TO CREATE YOUR FINISHED PAINTING:

This proven pathway helps you transform ideas into authentic artwork

STEP 1: MAP YOUR COMPOSITION

Draw your composition lightly on canvas to create a "roadmap" for smooth painting.

- ✓ Use your favorite composition sketch from your 3 Sharpie studies
- ✓ Fill the canvas boldly don't make your subject tiny
- ✓ Focus on interesting shape relationships make shapes that excite you
- ✓ Draw loosely and stay playful this unlocks the art inside you

STEP 2: BLOCK IN BACKGROUND COLORS

Choose 3-4 colors you love that work beautifully together.

✓ Feel free to start with colors straight from the bottle (no mixing pressure!)

✓ Paint your background colors into your composition with joy – put some music on and get into creative flow

✓ Use YOUR colors and vision – don't copy, use your own colors & subject, so you

develop your voice and your confidence**Trust your instincts** – you know more than you think

STEP 3: ADD YOUR SHAPES WITH COLLAGE OR PAINT

Fill in your shapes using your favorite materials and techniques.

- ✓ Paint from feeling, not your head this is where magic happens
- ✓ Stay open if it doesn't match your vision trust something greater is unfolding
- ✓ Embrace the messy middle all paintings go through this phase
- ✓ Let it be whimsical and uniquely YOURS this is your artistic voice

REMEMBER:

Stay loose, follow your bliss, and let your painting evolve naturally!
